## Planning Alternative Tomorrows with Hope "PATH" Training

The Arc of Fort Bend partnered with Texana Center Authority to sponsor PATH Facilitator's Training for all of the service coordinators in Fort Bend and surrounding five counties. Staff from The Arc of Texas conducted two, full-day trainings for the approximately 45 service coordinators. The service coordinators were chosen to be trained because they meet with families once a month to review services received from Medicaid waiver programs. The PATH process is a tool used to identify dreams/goals for the required person-directed plan. Activities planned to accomplish the identified goals must be both measurable and action oriented. In addition, the PATH plan identifies

existing and natural supports for the individual so that the activities are accomplished. At the end of the training, the service coordinators, now certified PATH facilitators, were asked to complete at least one PATH with a current client. Laura LaVigne and Margo Pasko also completed the training and are now certified PATH facilitators. They have offered to provide assistance to service coordinators who will be conducting PATH planning sessions with clients.

The Arc agreed to split the cost of this training with Texana Center Authority because the PATH process concentrates on the dreams of the client – choosing goals that are both positive and possible. Now, all service coordinators will have another tool to develop true, person-directed plans for their clients. This is a great way to "improve the quality of life for all"!

On Sunday, December 9, the TwentySomethings legislative advocacy team met at Spring Creek Barbecue to write letters to elected officials regarding Medicaid, to discuss the implications of the fiscal cliff, the debt ceiling and sequestration and to have a great barbecue lunch. State and national senators and representatives were invited to participate in the luncheon meeting. After listening to the presentation and participating in the discussions, several people wrote letters to their state representatives.

Congress Pete Olson was unable to attend, but his aide, Brock Gillespie, came to listen to concerns. Not only did he show up, but he stayed for two hours, listening to the concerns of the families. The members really appreciated Brock's participation. He also brought a letter from Congressman Olson applauding The Arc's work and and our community of families.

State Representative Ron Reynolds also attended. We really appreciate his participation! He has been a long time supporter of The Arc and issues affecting our community. Kevin Barker from Texana Center attended and explained implications of various funding scenarios on your lives. Some of the major concerns are the waiting for services, the freeze on general revenue funding, despite the massive need, and the need for a salary increase for the direct care staff in order to retain and attract the best people to work with the clients.

Phillip Pan of "Generation" ran the bingo game and expressed interest in joining the advocacy efforts (the next generation of leaders!). What would we do without the help of "Generation"?!

Where do we go from here? We will continue to reach out to our local representatives concerning the upcoming Texas legislative session. The December event was just the beginning of efforts to keep your concerns in the forefront. It will up to The Arc members to let their elected officials know their thoughts on the budget proposals. # **Apple of His Eyes Learning Center**

The Arc does not endorse, promote or recommend any particular person, place, therapy, institution, professional system or service. Our desire is to bring together families and those interested in meeting the needs of persons with disabilities. Please call to discuss your concerns and needs and perform "due diligence" when seeking a service provider.

A new childcare facility opened recently in the Sugar Land area specializing in providing care to children with disabilities and their siblings, ages 2 to 22 years old. Joy Fisher and her husband Tunde are the owners of "Apple of His Eyes Learning Center for special needs children & their siblings." Joy was a Special Education Teacher in Aldine ISD when she felt she could make a bigger difference. She began formulating her idea of a childcare facility and scouting for locations. Since Joy and her husband live in Stafford, they wanted to create a comfortable daycare close to home. Tunde Fisher is the pastor of Redeemed Christian Church of God, near Westheimer.

Joy believed there was too much paperwork and not enough teaching in special education to make a difference in the lives of her students. She wanted to focus on academics and social skills, making her students as independent as possible, with creative teaching and hands-on learning experiences. She felt that her students needed more OT/PT/ Music/Dance and ABA therapies than the school district provided. She decided that she wanted to open a childcare center to focus on fun education and activities that would enhance learning.

Apple of His Eyes has the capacity to serve 24 students. It is certified as a Licensed Daycare through the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services. The ideal student: teacher ratio, according to Joy, will be 1 teacher to 5, students, depending on the individual's mental age and needs. Joy indicated that there may be a mixture of ages in the classrooms. Parents may enroll their child for 2, 3 or 5 days per week, but Apple of His Eyes does not accept "drop-in" childcare. Meals are catered by Nuksy's Catering in Stafford. There is a microwave available in the kitchen for snacks and microwaveable breakfasts. Van service is not currently available but will be considered as enrollment grows.

The facility is located in a house that was a daycare center prior to Apple of His Eyes. There is a toddler room, closest to the restroom for children with toilet training, a pre-school room and an after-school program room. There is also a kitchen, dining room and a very large backyard with lots of potential.

Apple of His Eye will not be able to accommodate children using wheelchairs for mobility, as the doors to the restrooms are too narrow. However, Joy indicated that if the child can transfer and if the wheelchair can fit through the restroom door, she would consider enrollment. They do not have on-site nursing care so cannot accommodate medically fragile children.

The house is across the street from Mamie George Library and Dulles Middle School. The construction along Dulles Avenue makes finding the entrance a bit difficult right now, but it will improve!
